#### **Notes to the Accounts**

#### **Basis of Accounting**

The accounts have been prepared under the cash basis which is a change in the accounting policy used in previous years, (when the accruals basis for accounting was used) and which is in line with guidance provided by the Charity Commission for England and Wales for a charity of this size and nature. The impact on the accounts of this change is summarised below;

#### **Note 1 Donations**

Donations from members, friends and others total £310, excluding Gift Aid. No single donation exceeded £250.

#### **Note 2 Bank Interest**

£217 bank interest was earned on the COIF and Lloyds Bank deposit accounts held by the Society.

#### **Note 3 Gift Aid**

£3,673 Gift Aid was received in the year for the year to 30 June 2018, and a further £3,402 of

Gift Aid for the year to 30 June 2019 has been applied for but remained outstanding at the year end.

#### **Note 4 Concerts and Events Prior Year**

Late invoices in respect of the year ending 30 June 2018 and not provided for in the previous year's accounts total £1,078.

#### Reserves policy and current position

All activities and income are considered to be within a general, unrestricted fund.

In previous years, the Society has taken the view that the level of reserves required is £25,000. The level of reserves at the year end stood at £22,949, a drop caused by the Covid-19 pandemic which forced the abandonment of the Hayden/Mozart concert in March 2020, and the cancellation of the Come and Sing event in May 2020. Although there is a need for greater clarity about the effects of Covid-19 and the risks involved in staging choral performances in the Cathedral, the Society believes it has sufficient reserves to continue throughout the coming year.

Notwithstanding the above, the Society's concert planning and budgeting process aims to deliver an annual result of between a deficit and a surplus of £10,000.
